Explain one consequence of (4) - state a consequence (can be good or bad) and use facts to explain how it is the result of the factor in the question

Write a narrative account (8) - need to say what happened in the event in 3 paragraphs - cause, main events, outcome. You need to link these using words like - this led to, this caused. You also need to try to place this in the content of what's happening at the time. It must be written in chronological order

Importance question (8) - needs two paragraphs with a separate importance in each one. Need to start with Was important for Because. Add facts to support your view
