Tier 1 Rewards

House Point – 1 point

These should be rewarded frequently in lessons, to reinforce positive learning behaviours, with staff striving to reward them at a 3:1 ratio. They should be rewarded for consistently meeting or exceeding expectations.



Double House Points – 2 points

Double house points should be awarded when students' effort and academic risk taking are above average.



Engagement Points – 5 points

Should be awarded for student engagement in school events, fixtures, competitions and 100% attendance for the week; An award for contribution to college culture above and beyond what is celebrated within lessons.



Golden Ticket – 10 points

An instant reward given on the spot, and exchanged for a queue-jump pass in the canteen queue.

Each member of staff is allocated one Golden Ticket per day to award. Tickets can be given for exceptional work, displaying college values, or going above and beyond – like helping in the school community.





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Completed House Culture Card (Years 7&8) – 20 points

Signatures are collected based around the cultural focus at that time. When completed, the tutor adds this event to Bromcom.
