Overview

Throughout the week, students will participate in a variety of activities which explore our local culture, history and diversity. In school, students will participate in a number of theme based activities. Students will be split into two groups for these activities - Group A Blue (9.1-9.6); and Group B Yellow (9.7-9.11) When off-site, students will be split by tutor group.

Theme based learning/Curriculum Activities: Departments are planning individual sessions which explore exciting ideas and big questions within their subject area. Students will explore big ideas and work together on projects within the lesson.

Examples include:

Media - *Music Video Remix*

A vampire has sabotaged a selection of music videos. Can you use your video editing skills to put them back together?

History - *Who is the worst killer in History Working with others your job is to consider all the evidence, weighing up the motivation / numbers they killed/ who were their victims . To decide who deserves the title of 'Worst killer in History'*

Science - *Who stole the school's supply of Golden Tickets? Using forensic science and your crime*

fighting skills identify who robbed Miss Rogers of the school's most precious items of value. Earn the chance to win the legendary mythical platinum ticket and find out what power it holds!

Wednesday and Thursday will be 3 Period days. Each activity will last for 1 ½ hours.

Inflatables: Take part in a session of fun and teamwork. Games are designed for students to win valuable house points, all adding to our end of year totals.

Wise Up: Building on our Culture of Kindness, students will take part in a range of team building tasks and activities. Wise Up is an organisation that works with whole year groups - all at the same time. Be prepared to work hard and have fun.

Royal Navy: Fitness is the key. Take part in a physical session run by Personal Trainers from the Navy.

Sports Fest: A range of activities that students compete in for their House, including capture the flag, athletics, benchball, competitions and many more activities.

Food will be available between 11:00-12:00 on the Key Stage 3 playground. Students will be able to purchase food through this service using the normal method. Free School Meals will be available from this point.

All students will be given a free ice cream but can buy more if they wish from the ice cream vans that will be onsite.
