

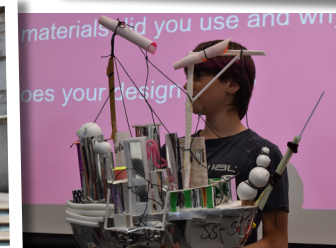
CULTURAL DAY 2023

The event concluded with a grand finale, where all the participants came together to sing and dance to the song 'Power in me.'

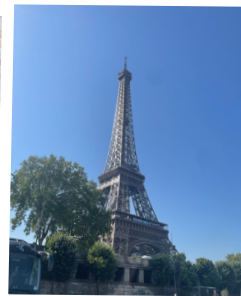

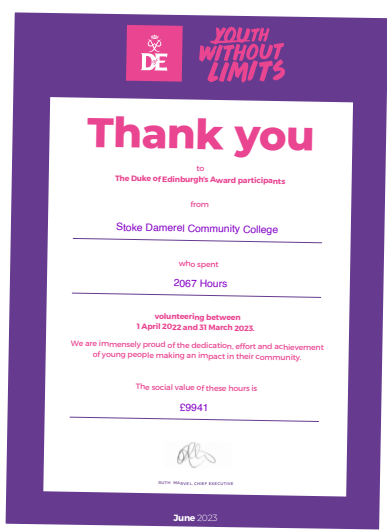
