Detention information

Stoke Damerel is dedicated to delivering a high quality educational experience. We believe that all students have the right to thrive in a secure, contented, and constructive atmosphere that offers the chance to make substantial progress and accomplish challenging objectives. In situations where students do not meet these standards, we want to be up front and clear that consequences are in place as follows and are non negotiable:

- Disruption in lessons or late to lessons removed to recovery centre 1 hour detention
