
MEET OUR NEW POET LAUREATE. MARIE!

Marie, our new Poet Laureate said, "I am shocked but am delighted! We all have our own problems, but it's good to talk about them and share our experiences. Expressing this



EXAM RESULTS 2023 STOKE DAMEREL'S **RECORD-BREAKING SUCCESS**

Stoke Damerel has achieved the best results ever! Results have improved year on year as you can see from the graph below:



A progress score of +0.21 shows that students at Stoke Damerel make better progress than they would in other schools nationally.

Stoke Damerel is ranked as the 2nd best comprehensive school in the city using the progress measures, and ranked 4th of any school in Plymouth, and is in the top 28% in the UK, classed as ABOVE AVERAGE.

Students work exceptionally hard and are well prepared for their examinations following our bespoke 'Year 11 Package', which includes daily after school revision sessions, Champions Hour from 4 - 5pm; bespoke English and Maths every morning and afternoon; tailored revision homework and exam questions every week.

Some great achievements:

- Freddie, Deven and Izzahin all averaging above a grade 8!
- Deven achieved 159 out of 160 in his English Lit exam dropping only one mark across 4 hours of English examinations.

At A-Level 78% of students went onto university, with standouts for Ronnie, B, Di*, Di*, Tanisha receiving Di, Di, Di and we have to mention Kuba who is off to Southampton University to study Mechanical Engineering, Aerospace.

SAFEGUARDING UPDATE

SAFEGUARDING ISSUES FOR PARENTS - VAPING

Stoke Damerel Community College, like many other schools across the country, has seen a recent spike in incidents involving student vaping.

- The vapour can contain nicotine, which is highly addictive, and other substances which are concerning.
- Inhaling any substance is not risk-free
- There has been a rapid increase in our community for adding a substance that is thought to be THC liquid or other synthetic derivatives to vapes.
- THC oil is a thick, sticky yellow / brown liquid chemical from the cannabis plant.
- THC is illegal in the UK
- Students can overdose on THC very easily as it is inhaled causing them to become unwell and needing medical attention or hospitalisation - this could happen to your child!

We take this issue very seriously due to the negative health effects vaping can have on our students and often find that our parents/carers may not be aware of the risks around vaping. The



increase in vaping prompted us to do more research and we want to share our findings with you.

Vaping is prohibited in our behaviour policy, and will be subject to sanctions. Possessing, handling, providing and using a vape containing THC on our school site is a serious breach of our behaviour policy and a 'line in the sand' that the school and governors will not tolerate. THC is an illegal substance that is not permitted on the school site.

We encourage you to have a conversation with your child about this topic, and to contact us if you are concerned about your child. If your child needs some support or wants to discuss this with someone in school, please direct them to the safeguarding team.

APP SPOTLIGHT TIKTOK: A FUN AND CREATIVE PLATFORM
