

Dear Parent/Carer,

As you are aware the school has been supporting the NSPCC on a campaign aimed at addressing the impact of pornography on young people.

The play has been developed in collaboration with students to explore young people's experiences of the online world. The drama will be performed by a professional theatre company and tell the stories of three young people and the challenges they face navigating the online world- from exposure to pornography to sharing of images. The performance is followed by a workshop session, led by the theatre's outreach worker where the students will help decide what the characters do next.

As a school, we will also be using resources provided by the theatre company and the NSPCC to continue the learning within school.

To support parents at this difficult time navigating the world of young people online. The NSPCC have created opportunities for parents to see the performance online.
