Dear Parent / Carer,

As we approach the end of the Summer Term may I take this opportunity to thank all of you as parents/carers for the support that you have given to your child and us as a College throughout this academic year. We have not only been focused on the preparation for their GCSE's next year but have also had a number of events that have supported the students in making decisions and preparing for their futures at this crucial time in their lives as they move into their final year at school.

It has been amazing to see the investment that students are putting into their education, both inside the classroom and outside. Many students have been involved in Duke of Edinburgh, attending trips to Plymouth University, as well as being part of the Sports Leaders Academy.
